- Family physicians and specialists with pain management and/or addiction focus
- Currently engaged in the opioid response

MENTEES ARE:

 Family physicians who want to build their confidence and capacity in treating patients with chronic pain and/or addiction

THE CMN PROVIDES:

- Orientation for mentors and mentees
- Secure on-line platform for discussions and questions
- Local mentoring events
- Webinars and teleconferences
- Annual mentorship conference
- Information about relevant events/activities/ resources/research
- Remuneration for mentors
- CPD certification for mentees

Collaborative Mentorship Networks and the Opioid Crisis

The initial focus of mentoring goals will be in actively addressing the opioid crisis in Alberta. Mentors will support mentees with:

- Actively prescribing Opioid Agonist Therapies (OATs)
- Identifying patients with, or at risk of, opioid dependency
- Supporting patients through relapse and withdrawal
- Knowledge and use of community resources
- Supporting patients with pain management
- Building capacity within their clinic teams
- Appropriate and timely referral to specialists and more!
